
Welcome to your new adventure!

As a **Venturing Crew committee member** or chair you will have the opportunity to make a positive difference in the life of young people and families. The Boy Scouts of America and the Great Salt Lake Council has the training and support to help make your opportunity simple, rewarding, and fun! The steps below will get you started.

Before Your First Meeting

- If you have not already, register as a Crew committee member (or chair) by completing the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) adult application, and getting the proper approval from your chartered organization representative.

As part of the application and joining process, you will have to take *Venturing Youth Protection Training*. This course is required of all adults in Scouting and will teach you the BSA's policies for safely and appropriately interacting with youth.

Youth Protection Training can be found online at www.My.Scouting.org. If you have not already, you will need to set up your My.Scouting account. My.Scouting will be very important as you start and continue in Venturing. It will be a source for training, rosters, information, and a whole lot more.

Note: When you receive your BSA membership number (after your registration is complete you can get it from your crew Advisor, crew committee chair, chartered organization representative, or by calling the council service center) be sure it is entered into your My.Scouting profile so you can get credit for training and have access to My.Scouting Tools for your Scouting role.

- At the end of the course, print off the Venturing Youth Protection Certificate and letter, and turn in the certificate with your application.

- Next, either attend a Crew Committee Challenge training course in person and/or complete the online learning plans for the training "Before the First Meeting" on www.My.Scouting.org. This course will begin building the foundation you need to become an effective and successful leader.
- Visit www.Venturing.org. This will be the main on-line place for you to find resources. You will also find local Scouting information at www.SaltLakeScouts.org.
- Become acquainted with the other leaders in your crew - especially the youth leaders and advisors. You will work closely with the crew president, Advisors, and the chartered organization representative.

Within the First Month

In addition to crew meetings:

- If you have not already, attend a *Crew Committee Challenge* training course or complete the online learning plans for the training "Within the First 30 Days" and "Position Trained" on My.Scouting.



Once you have attended this training you are considered trained and eligible to wear the "Trained" leader patch on your uniform. Remember, every youth deserves a trained and qualified leader!

- Attend the monthly crew committee meeting.
- Attend the monthly crew officers meeting where the youth leaders make plans for the crew meetings and activities.

What Do You Invest in Venturing?

- One evening each month for the crew committee meeting and/or crew officers' meeting
 - Time spent in Venturing leader training
 - Cost of the Venturing leader uniform

You also may invest:

- One evening each week for the crew meeting
- One weekend a month for an outdoor activity
- One week a year for an outdoor adventure

This adds up to a small investment compared to the dividends you will receive. And, of course, the more you invest, the more you will receive in return.

What Do You Receive in Return?

- An evening each week, and a weekend each month, of fun and learning with your Venturers
- The privilege of helping to enrich and strengthen the lives of your Venturers, to prepare them for life!
- The experience of learning leadership and new skills yourself as you help youth learn
- An opportunity to share your ideas and experiences with youth leaders and other adults and put your talents into action
- A chance to enjoy the great outdoors as you learn and teach important skills and connect youth to nature
- A growing admiration for youth and their growing respect for you as their advisor and friend
- A chance to help youth learn good citizenship and help shape them into adults with strength of character who are sensitive to the needs of others
- The opportunity to make a difference in the lives of youth as they grow strong in mind and body
- A code to live by that will set a worthwhile example for youth and adults as you do your duty to God and our country
- The satisfaction of being a member of a worldwide organization and pride in being publicly identified as a part of this organization by wearing the uniform, which is a visible means of showing that you believe in and stand for its ideals and objectives

You will discover many other dividends that will enrich your life as you dedicate your time, talent, and enthusiasm to Venturing.

All leaders bring to Venturing their own talents and skills, their own backgrounds and interests. Your key to becoming an effective leader is to use your own abilities and interests, along with what you learn in and about Venturing, to plan and conduct the best possible program for the Venturers. What happens in the life of each young

person during these critical years will determine to a great extent the kind of adult they will become.
